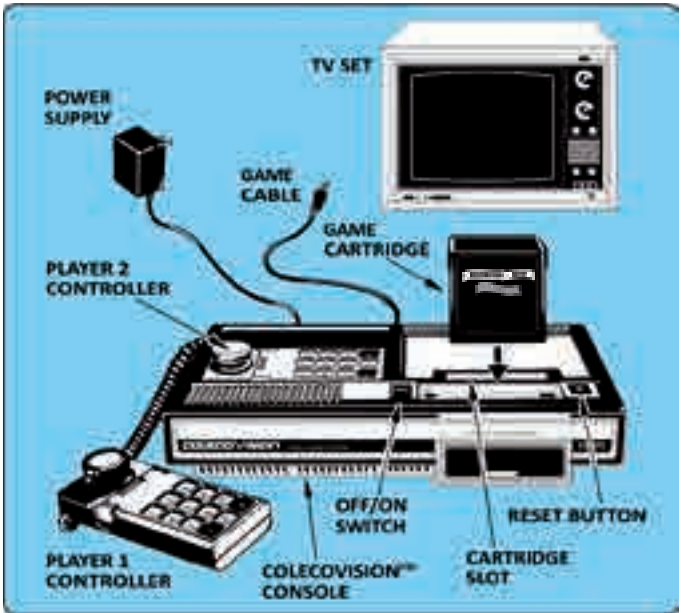

GET READY TO PLAY



- Make sure the COLECOVISION™ or compatible console is connected to TV. Make sure power supply is plugged into console. Then plug power supply into a 110/120 volt AC outlet.
- TV should be on and tuned accordingly to your console manual.
- **ALWAYS MAKE SURE COLECOVISION™ OR COMPATIBLE UNIT IS OFF BEFORE INSERTING OR REMOVING A CARTRIDGE.**
Turn **Off/On** switch to **On** after cartridge is inserted.

USING YOUR CONTROLLERS



Push Control Stick right or left to turn. Press left Side Button to accelerate. Press right Side Button to slowly go backwards. Push Control Stick up or down to go forward or to reverse.

HERE'S HOW TO PLAY

When you start the cartridge, you can choose between 3 kinds of play: Destruction Derby, Death Race or World Tour.

In the two first games, you can change the settings: one or two players, the speed, the time for each round and the type of the arena.

Choose World Tour for a one-player-only game across the different screens.





Each time you crash a target with enough speed, you get one point. The wrecked target becomes an obstacle.

When time is over in a two player game, the player with the highest score wins. A menu allows you to replay, change the settings or go back to main menu.

In a one player game, the game ends when time is over and you get back to main menu.

TRIVIA

Exidy released its first arcade driving game, **Destruction Derby**, in 1975. Players had to crash into cars to get points.

Exidy licensed its game to arcade game company **Chicago Coin** to manufacture. However, the following year Chicago Coin entered financial difficulties which would eventually lead to the dissolution of the company, and as Exidy had sold exclusive manufacturing rights they could no longer profit from Destruction Derby.

Needing an interim product to introduce to distributors until their subsequent game **Car Polo** (1977) was completed, they decided to modify the Destruction Derby game so that it would be sale-able by their organization. They made several modifications in order to create this new product: **Death Race**.

The enemy opponents were changed to animated figures ("gremlins") which walked around the screen instead of vehicles. The name "**Death Race**" was chosen as a reflection of the undead monsters depicted in the cabinet art and marketing.

The original working title for the game which appeared on some early advertisements was **Death Race 98**. As the content of the game was centered on killing humanoid figures, it attracted a great deal of controversy. In 1976, newspapers and civic organizations began to attack the game for facilitating violence in virtual form.

Many at Exidy attribute a large jump in sales for the company to this increase in national media for Death Race, even though most of the coverage was negative. By the end of 1977 the game no longer graced headlines.

THE FUN OF DISCOVERY

This instruction booklet will provide the basic information you need to get started playing NOMDUJEU™, but it is only the beginning! You will find that this cartridge is full of special features that make NOMDUJEU™ exciting every time you play. Experiment with different techniques and enjoy the game!
